We want to thank everyone who was a part of our annual holiday gift drive. This year, we were able to provide gifts to 14 residents and over 50 children in our permanency program. Everyone was asked if there was a specific item they wanted, along with what their other interests were. We handed out lots of Legos and Barbies, arts and crafts kits, sports balls, and more.

We continue to accept donations of new toys and hobby items throughout the year.

Our donation room doors stay open year-round to help families when they might need new shoes, or even to celebrate a client's accomplishments. Here's a general list of items that are commonly asked for:

- YA books and novels
- Duffel bags
- Backpacks
- Toiletry items
- Legos
- Bracelet making kits

- Children's picture books
- Socks
- Winter accessories
- Headphones/speakers
- Fidget toys
- Barbies

Outside of toys, we are continuing to ask for gift cards and home linens.

Gift cards

Sometimes, when children come into our care, they arrive with next to nothing. It is important for us to have access to instant "cash" to be able to provide basic items like clothes and shoes - anything to help make a HOME. "Big" retailers like Target and Walmart are helpful due to their variety of items in store.

Home Linens

When a new resident comes to stay with us, we provide new bed linens and towels. Recently, our supply has run drastically low. It is important for us not only for the cleanliness of our facilities, but also to be able to provide a warm and welcoming environment for everyone who comes to stay with us. Here's a list of items we like to keep in stock:

- Bed sheets, twin and twin XL
- Comforters, twin and twin XL
- "Bed-in-a-bag"s, twin and twin XL
- Throw blankets
- Bed pillows
- Towels
- Washcloths
